REPORT FOR ACADEMIC YEAR
2021-2021

Last school year began with a lessening of Covid protocols. Masking indoors was still required by the university, but any constraints on the size of our gatherings or where we could meet had been removed. This played a vital role in the return of energy and connection between students as the semester started. To aid this many of our events and discipleship times moved outside on campus and small family meals became a more common sight.

CSF held many of our typical ministry opportunities through the year. Sunday Morning Worship, Wednesday Night Bible Study, Small Groups and Retreats all continue to be core to the things that we do, as well as discipleship of students by staff and student leaders. In all of these we point to Jesus as Lord of our lives and equip these students for Kingdom work.



Fall Retreat is always a huge part of building community in our ministry, but this year it hit different. For our Freshmen and Sophomores, this was one of the first times that we were in a big group for an extended period of time. We dug into the character of God as shown in

"CSF Family" times also played a huge role in us seeking the Lord and growing in unity this year. Meals, celebrations, coffeehouse, retreats...all of these times connected students, equipped them, and helped them grow in their love for Jesus.

Within all of those things there continues to be so much need on our campuses. Students need Jesus. They need the hope that He brings and the life that He gives. Many students don't know who Jesus is or what Christianity is really about. On another level, mental strain and overwhelm is an epidemic in itself. The reasons are varying and complex, but on a daily basis we are engaging with

We want to walk alongside these students, to share life with them, and to show them the One that brings hope and joy and life into our existence.

Please pray that students would be looking for community. Pray for students to develop a holy curiosity and seek out who Jesus is. Pray for followers of Jesus on campus to be involved in every corner of it; that there would be no student on campus that would not have a follower of Christ in their lives.
